Founded in 1921, Soroptimist, or “Best for Women”, is a global volunteer organization for women with the mission of improving the lives of women and girls through programs leading to social and economic empowerment. Soroptimist International holds a United Nations non-governmental organization consultative status.

The local club, “Soroptimist International Connecticut Shoreline”, chartered with an initial 13 members who are committed to the core values of gender equality, empowerment, education, diversity, and fellowship for women and girls in local communities and throughout the world.

Beth Peterson, of Groton, will be installed as the club’s first president. “These are women in our community who wish to contribute their time to helping other women,” Peterson said. “Our club has set out to enhance the status of women and girls, and empower them both locally and globally.” The club’s next meeting is on January 9th from 6:00–7:30pm at the Groton Public Library with a guest speaker from the Connecticut Women’s Education and Legal Fund (CWEALF).
